

## RESOLUTION 05/03

RELATING TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN IOTC PROGRAMME OF INSPECTION IN PORT



### REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

There is one reporting requirement that has not been superseded by requirements in Resolution 16/11. The port State must submit electronically to the IOTC Executive Secretary by 1 July of each year, the list of foreign fishing vessels which have landed in their ports tuna and tuna-like species caught in the IOTC area in the preceding year. The catch composition must be reported by weight and species landed.

Submit list of foreign fishing vessels that have landed tuna and tuna-like species caught in the IOTC area in their ports, detailing the weight and species of the catch

### WHEN

**DEADLINES**1 July, annually

# REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: FORMAT AND CONTENT

One reporting template has been developed by the Secretariat to facilitate the reporting under this resolution.

### **REPORTING REQUIREMENT 1:**

SUBMIT A LIST OF FOREIGN FISHING VESSELS THAT HAVE LANDED TUNA AND TUNA-LIKE SPECIES CAUGHT IN THE IOTC AREA IN THEIR PORTS, DETAILING THE WEIGHT AND SPECIES OF THE CATCH. (PARA 8)

### **IMPLEMENTATION**

- <u>How to report:</u> Port State CPCs must use the template form developed for this purpose. It applies to all designated ports in the country, and to all foreign vessels landing tuna and tuna-like species harvested in the IOTC area.
- Reporting format: The report must be submitted in specified file format. The template spread-sheet form can be accessed under http://www.iotc.org/compliance/reporting-templates
