#### Position of the People's Republic of China on Yellowfin Tuna Allocated Catch Limit for 2022 in IOTC Area.

Dear Mr. O'Brien:

Thank you for sending IOTC Circular 2021-78 regarding yellowfin tuna allocated catch limit for 2022.

However, we understand that it is a long-standing practice of IOTC to separate the tuna catch from fleet of the mainland of China and the Taiwan province of China, and also this delegation mentioned clearly during the 25th session of IOTC that the catch limit for the mainland of China shall be applied by paragraph 7, and paragraph 11 shall apply to catch limit of the Taiwan province of China. Based on the long-standing practice of IOTC, the yellowfin tuna catch limit for the People's Republic of China in 2022 shall be 15,339 mt (4,641 mt for the mainland of China and 10,688 mt for the Taiwan province of China), not 10,557 mt. Therefore this delegation cannot agree to use paragraph 5 to calculate the yellowfin tuna catch limit for the People's Republic of China in 2022.

I wish the secretariat can circulate this letter to all CPCs of IOTC.
